VOLUNTEER LETTER



New Hatchery Manager



Kelly Taylor has been promoted to Hatchery Manager at Chattahoochee Forest NFH following the 2014 retirement of Deborah Burger. Taylor received his bachelor's degree in Biology from Georgia Southern in 1992 and began working at Bo Ginn National Fish Hatchery in Millen, GA, as animal caretaker (NTE 1 year) in 1994. In 1996, Taylor served as a tractor operator at Bo Ginn being employed half-time by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the other by the state of Georgia (wearing a federal uniform half of each week and a state uniform the other). Bo Ginn NFH ceased operation by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 1996 and transferred to State of Georgia Park Systems, resulting in Taylor's transfer to animal caretaker at Wolf Creek National Fish Hatchery in Jamestown, KY, then to Chattahoochee Forest National Fish Hatchery in 1999 where he gained permanent employment status and served as a

Fishery Biologist since 2000. Since 2004, Taylor has served in management capacity and at a supervisory level since 2006. In 2008, Taylor was also delegated the task of temporarily serving as Acting Hatchery Manager for Erwin National Fish Hatchery, in Erwin, TN. Finally, Taylor has served as Acting Hatchery Manager at Chattahoochee Forest National Fish Hatchery since April 2014 leading to the official promotion to Hatchery Manager effective January 10, 2016.

Construction Complete

"Yes, that's correct! Construction is finally complete," says Kelly Taylor. Chattahoochee Forest National Fish Hatchery re-opened its doors to visitors on September 9, 2015, after being closed to visitation since August 4, 2014. The year-long project resulted in the reconstruction of 18 outdoor raceways that should successfully support the trout rearing process for many more years to come. Fortunately, 2015 fish rearing and stocking were virtually unaffected by the construction as scheduled stockings and production numbers were fulfilled.

The new raceways are already in use and awaiting visitors as shown on following page with Mitch Pickelsimer pictured. Stop by and see us during visitor hours Monday-Friday from 8 a.m.-3 p.m. (closed on federal holidays). Please always call in advance of visiting as there are other conditions such as weather that could result in visitor gates being closed.




Trout 2016



These are big shoes to fill, but a challenge I had been awaiting. On January 10, 2016, I was officially promoted to Hatchery Manager.

Just to give you a little background information on me, I have been working for the Service for 20 years. My career started at the Bo Ginn National Fish Hatchery below Augusta, Georgia. From there, I went to the Wolf Creek National Fish Hatchery in Kentucky. I've spent the last 16 years of my career here at Chattahoochee Forest National Fish Hatchery.

If you have been following on Facebook, you will know that last year was consumed with construction here at the hatchery. Eighteen raceways and existing supply lines and drain lines, were re-constructed.
