
## **Never-ending Summer**

Cory was hired in April through the Veterans Recruitment Authority (VRA) and is filling a term position as a Motor Vehicle Operator. Cory has been a major asset to the Chattahoochee family and is getting to know his way around hatchery life quickly. We hope to have him around for a very long time.

The hatchery had a great year in fish production and put out some amazing fish. Even though the regular stocking season is over, we are still putting fish in the Delayed Harvest sections. For more information please call the hatchery or visit our Facebook page. All four of the hatchery sponsored fishing events in 2016 were a huge success, mostly due to huge turnout of volunteers that came out and supported each event. Without your help these events would not be possible, so Thanks for making them great.

The hatchery has done some other great things in 2016. We have had the pleasure of being able to get out and

spread the word of our hatchery works to the local schools, private organizations, and outdoor youth events. It's an important job to spread the word on just what and why we do what we do. We've also been able to help jump start a fascinating program initiated by Trout Unlimited called Trout in the Classroom. This program gives the kids a chance to grow trout in their classroom, with eggs or fry provided by the hatchery, and watch and care for them throughout the rearing cycle. It's a program that not only covers the fundamentals of the science curriculum, but also has the kids dabble in Math, English, and Technology. It's a great program and both the kids and teachers learn a lot from the program.

In 2017, the hatchery will be working with other species other than trout. We've been helping GA DNR out with studies on Bog Turtles for the past few years. In 2016, the hatchery built an artificial mountain bog to house these turtles. The hatchery will receive turtles from the Knoxville Zoo, with the goal of propagation of these animals to restock some of the bogs in the North Georgia area. Another project we will be undertaking will be to create a 6500 square foot area for pollinators and Monarch butterfly habitat.

The end of 2016 has seen one of the worst droughts in years. Hatchery records show that we have had a 48% reduction in water flow from this time this year to this time last year.

While rain doesn't seem to be coming anytime soon, we are still marching ahead with production and should-n't have any problems with making sure there are plenty of trout for opening day of stocking season. With the severe drought conditions comes increased fire behavior. Two of our crew members have been aiding in the efforts of fire suppression. Mr. Terry Callihan has been aiding the USFS on the Rough Ridge fire and I have been aiding the USFS with many of the local fires in the area. Well that about

wraps up 2016 in a nutshell. Hope to see you all on the creek banks when stocking season rolls around. Until then, have a safe and wonderful Holiday Season.
