

Go fishing!


2017 was a great year in fish production and the hatchery put out some amazing fish. Even though the regular stocking season is over, we are still putting fish in the

Delayed Harvest sections. For more information please call the hatchery or visit our Facebook page. All four of the hatchery sponsored fishing events in 2017 were a huge success, mostly due to huge turnout of volunteers that came out and supported each event. Without your help these events would not be possible, so Thanks for making them great and help spreading the joy of fishing to our youth.

The hatchery has done some other great things in 2017. We have had the pleasure of being able to get out and spread the word of our hatchery works in the local schools, to private organizations, and at outdoor youth events. Twenty-one different outreach events to be exact. It is an important job to spread the word on just what and why we do what we

do. We have also been able to help jump start ten different Trout in the Classroom programs this year. This program gives the kids a chance to grow trout in their classroom, with eggs or fry provided by the hatchery, and watch and care for them throughout the rearing cycle. It's a program that not only covers the fundamentals of the science curriculum, but also use their Math, English, and Technology skills. It's a great program and both the kids and teachers learn a lot from the program.

In 2018, will see the hatchery again working with other species other



than trout. We will continue helping GA DNR out with surveys on Bog Turtles and Eastern Hellbenders. In 2016, the hatchery built an artificial mountain bog to house these turtles. Although the hatchery did not receive turtles from the Knoxville Zoo, due to some paperwork being lost we hope to have them in their new home in Spring of 2018. Another project we will be undertaking will be to create a 6500 square foot area for pollinators and Monarch butterfly habitat.

The 2016 drought has carried over into the 2017, but finally got some much needed rain in March. Production efforts for the year march on and we should have no problems with making sure there are plenty of trout for opening day of stocking season. Well that about wraps up 2017 in a nutshell. Hope to see you all on the creek banks when stocking season rolls around.
