VOLUNTEER LETTER



Trout for 2013

As things stand now, we will be doing all of our regular stocking for 2013 (March thru Labor Day). Currently, we are operating under a Continuing Resolution (CR) which runs out at the end of March. Some of our stocking may be affected when the final budget comes through, but we won't know that until we see it.

The National Fish Hatchery System has operated with an extremely tight budget for several years, even as its operating costs have risen significantly. This has been especially true in the Southeast region which has suffered base erosion due to a succession of flat and/or declining hatchery budgets that did not keep up with inflation and spiraling fuel, utilities, and feed costs.

Under the FY 2013 Continuing Resolution (CR), the Southeast Region's Fisheries Program experienced a severe hatchery budget shortfall. On April 1, 2013, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will have to make some decisions regarding this huge budget shortfall. Last year's shortfall was supported by Congress and money was restored to the fisheries budget to cover the shortfall. The language basically said that Congress supports our trout hatcheries and what we do and that federal trout hatcheries were to be fully funded.

Thanks to the hard work by Terry, Mitch, Kelly, and Jamey, we have some beautiful fish to stock out. We have beautiful brook trout as well as rainbows. The cooler weather and rain sure are a big help. Keep an eye out on <u>www.gofishgeorgia.com</u> for the upcoming 2013 trout season dates and regulations.

New Economic Data

Hot off the press economic data shows that the Chattahoochee Forest NFH fish production supports more than 330 jobs, with an **economic output of \$30.3 million!** Retail sales associated with angler expenditures as a result of stocking trout by the Chattahoochee Forest NFH amounted to \$16 million. Almost \$5 million of these expenditures relate to costs for food and lodging and transportation. Each taxpayer dollar spent for trout production at the hatchery generates \$40.47 in economic output.

For example, a family purchases a set of fishing rods for an upcoming vacation. Part of the total purchase price will go to the local retailer. The retail store pays a wholesaler who in turn pays the manufacturer. In this way, each dollar of local retail expenditures can affect a variety of businesses at local, regional and national levels. The economic impact is felt by everyone, not just those associated with selling fishing equipment. This is especially true in small towns and rural areas near the waters that are stocked by the Chattahoochee Forest NFH and where the purchases of fishing equipment, license, lodging, food, and transportation are made. Let's keep Fannin County the Trout Capitol of Georgia!

Last Year's Fishing Events

The 2012 fishing events were a huge success, thanks to all of you wonderful volunteers. Friends of the Hatchery, Trout Unlimited and other volunteers provided hundreds of dollars worth of food, prizes and educational materials and supplies for 150 + participants at the Veterans Appreciation, 200+ participants at the Special Kids Rodeo, 250+ participants at the Seniors Rodeo, and 800+ in attendance at the Family Fishing Festival. In addition, many hours of volunteer work were also provided. These extra special events would not be possible without you. Please note the dates for the 2013 events on page 3.

In addition to our annual fishing events, the hatchery provides several hundred eggs to various school groups in support of the Trout in the Classroom programs. We also provided outreach events for the University of Georgia Environmental Day, Project Healing Waters, Sam Hogsed Youth Hunting and Fishing Conservation Day, Wildgame Supper at House of Prayer, Fannin County High School Career Day, Woody Gap Agricultural Day, and the Alternative Education Program. We also participated in the annual Rivers Alive Cleanup. The Union County Chamber of Commerce and Windstream did an excellent outreach video of the hatchery and our program that is now airing on Channel 4 Comcast Network. These are just some of the educational and outreach events that the hatchery participates in every year. As you can see, we stay busy!

We are in need of volunteers. If you have the time and could possibly help with any of our events, please call us. We need help with presenting educational programs, preparing and serving food, helping kids fish, set up prior to events and cleanup. It is really an enjoyable way to give back to your community.
